
Making <u>ABC's See What They Say</u> Multiple Sensory. Big sisters have fun teaching their little 2-year old brother the shapes and sounds of the letters using his 3 senses, through 3 Tactile Steps: Visual, Auditory, and Tactile. Or, Sight, Hearing and Touch.



1. The **1st Tactile step** is to transfer the picture clue. Big Sister says, "Can you take the ball from this picture and move it into this Imaginary ball?"




2. Little brother pretends to take the ball off the <u>Picture Page</u> and moves it into the spot for the imaginary ball on the <u>Plain Letter Page</u>.



3. Sister says, "Now take the Bat and move it onto where the Imaginary Bat is."



4. Then he sets the bat onto where he now literally sees an Imaginary BAT!



5. The **2nd Tactile step** is using an imaginary camera to take a picture of the picture clue because it's going to Disappear! And you have to remember it.



6. Then Sister folds the Picture Clue page behind using the Spiral Binding, so brother *only* sees the Plain Letter. She asks, "Where is the bat?" He points to it. Then she asks, "Where's the ball?" He points to it. Clue Lesson learned!!



7. Now for the Sound. I apologize for the blurry picture, but this **3rd TACTILE Step** uses motion. Sister says, "It's time to use our "Choppers." To use your Choppers, raise both hands in the air, and while quickly bringing them down in a *chopping* motion, repeat these words 3 times in a row: "Bat says /b/." A letter between slashes means to say the *sound* of the letter only. When you say the sound /b/, you lower your choppers, thus *chopping* off the sound of letter b, which is simply chopping off the beginning of the word "bat." Don't say /bu/.

Saying and chopping: Bat says /b/ Bat says /b/ Bat says /b

This is SUPER FUN for everyone! And the little learners especially LOVE to hear the words, "Get your Choppers ready." And they get their cute, little choppers all set to go!

These <u>3 Tactile Steps</u> really CEMENT these very <u>Visual</u> Picture Clues right on top of the letters, and the <u>Sounds</u> onto the Picture Clues. If your child or student forgets the sound, all you need do is to ask the Magic Question, "What does it *look* like?" They *see* a bat, and just know that it says /b/... like bat.
